What are the Classes Like?

Some involve lectures and discussions, while others focus on hands-on practice, including:

- Five Required Courses (**17 units**)
- Culminating Experience (**6 units**)
 - ☐ Students will complete either an internship project related to fieldwork or a thesis.
- Electives (**9 units**)
 - ☐ Students must complete three graduate level courses offered by the Psychology department (or related fields outside of Psychology with approval of the graduate advisor).

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Psychology Department Graduates Will Be Well-Equipped To:

- Pursue careers with public or non-profit organizations assessing policies and evaluating program effectiveness.
- Work as statistical and psychometric consultants.
- Pursue Ph.D. programs in Psychology or related fields.
- Work in research institutions or academia.
- Apply psychological expertise in various industries, including healthcare, government, and business as well as non-profit organizations.



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ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Requirements for Applicants:

- Have completed a four-year college or university program in Psychology or a related scientific field (e.g., Biology or Cognitive Science) and hold an acceptable bachelor's degree from an accredited institution.
- Be in good academic standing at the last college or university attended.
- Have earned a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 in the bachelor's degree program.
- Have attained a minimum GPA of 2.5 (A = 4.0) in the last 60 semester units or 90 quarter units attempted.



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PRE-REQUISITES

Applicants must have completed foundation courses with **at least a grade of C** to qualify for admission.

Required coursework:

- Introduction to Psychology
- Biostatistics or Introductory Statistics
- Psychological Research & Statistical Methods (or equivalent)

Conditional admission may be offered to non-psychology majors; prerequisites must be completed before starting the program.

Application Requirements Summary:

1. GPA Requirements:

Preferred: Minimum GPA of 3.0

Considered (Conditional): GPA between 2.5 – 2.99 with additional supporting evidence.

2. Personal Statement:

Length: 500 words

Content Must Include: Educational background, research experience, career goals, etc.

Application Requirements Summary:

3. Résumé or Curriculum Vitae (CV): Must be uploaded

4. Letters of Recommendation:

Total Required: 3

Minimum from Psychology Faculty: 2

Other acceptable: Faculty from other disciplines

Content: Should reflect academic background and performance

5. Application Fee:

Amount: \$70 (non-refundable)
