FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQs)

1. What is the Psychology Transfer Learning Community (TLC)?

The Psychology TLC provides transfer students an opportunity to take critical gateway courses and courses focusing on graduate schools and careers along with a group of your peers during your first year at CI. Interactions with peers and faculty will build a supportive community to help you finish your degree in a timely manner and enter the next phase of your academic or professional life with confidence.

2. How will I benefit from participating in the TLC?

The TLC's mission is to foster a successful transition into CI for transfer students, provide an enhanced academic experience, and connect you with career, internship, as well as research opportunities. While participating in the TLC, you will also have reserved seats for important Fall and Spring classes within the Psychology Program. In addition, you will meet with a TLC faculty member monthly who will serve as an additional resource and mentor. You will also have the support of peers in your Pod!

3. How many TLC classes do I have to take?

We believe the following schedule of 8 major courses will set you up to succeed within the Psychology Program in later semesters. In Fall 2022, you will be pre-registered for 4 classes, all of which are scheduled to take place in-person, on-campus:

- PSY 300 Psychological Research and Statistical Methods I (4 units) - Mon 9-11:50am (Lecture) and Wed 10-11:50am (Lab) with Dr. Kee-Rose
- PSY 310 History & Systems of Psych. (3 units) - Mon 12-2:50pm with Dr. Krause
- PSY 313 Clinical & Abnormal Psych. (3 units) - Wed 12-2:50 with Dr. Bennett
- PSY 490 Navigating Careers in Psych. (3 units) - Wed 3-5:50pm with Dr. Smith

In Spring 2023, you will be registered for another 4 major courses (schedule is to be determined):


- PSY 301 Psychological Research and Statistical Methods and Lab II (4 units)
- PSY 317 Theories of Personality (3 units)
- PSY 445 Adolescent Development (3 units)
- PSY 492 Internship/Service Learning or PSY 494 Independent Study (3 units)

4. What happens if I drop a course in the series?

The courses are linked together in the TLC system. As such, dropping one or more of the courses will lead to your removal from the TLC and your reserved seats for Fall or Spring classes will no longer be available. However, you will still be able to register and enroll for courses just like other Psychology students.

5. Can I register for more courses than the four major courses associated with the TLC?

As part of the TLC, students will be enrolled in 13 units. Increasing your course load beyond these 13 units is entirely up to you. However, a full-time enrollment for undergraduate students at CI is 12 or more units (up to 18 units maximum) each semester. If you register for an additional class, be sure to not enroll in any of the courses that the TLC offers in the Spring (see above). If you would like recommendations for an additional course, please contact your TLC advisors.



6. Do all transfer students participate in the TLC?

No, but it is highly recommended given the benefits of participating in the TLC.

7. Do I have to live on campus to be part of the TLC?

No, the TLC is open to resident and commuter students.

8. Do I have to pay to participate in the TLC?

There is no additional cost to join the TLC.

9. What are the requirements for transfer students to participate in the TLC?

Placement in the TLC requires completion of the following:

- You must be a full-time transfer student majoring in Psychology.
- You must commit to a 1-year learning community pathway, with the specific schedule, as listed above.
- You must have completed and passed at least two lower division courses in Psychology with a grade of C or better: PSY 100 Introduction to Psychology (or General Psychology) and PSY 202/MATH 202 Biostatistics (or Introductory Statistics or Statistics for the Behavioral Sciences).
- You will be invited to attend a brief virtual orientation (via Zoom) on Thursday, July 7 from 12-1pm.

10. What do students have to say about participating in the TLC?

Spooner Greenbirg and Anabiah Syed (TLC Scholars, 2021-22) described their experience:

"Coming onto a new campus as transfer students can be stressful and anxiety-inducing as you go from having mastered your community college campus, to entering a whole new world where, despite being juniors, you are completely unfamiliar with everything and know absolutely no one. Luckily, we were very privileged to be members of CSUCI's Psychology Transfer Learning Community (TLC). The TLC program was an instrumental and integral part of our success as third year students. As TLC members, we were placed in a structured curriculum of classes which we attended together as cohorts throughout the fall and spring semesters. This cohesive immersion enabled us to bond on a deeper level and fostered our ability to help one another on both a personal and academic basis. Additionally, we received outstanding guidance, support, and built significant mentor-mentee relationships with our four TLC faculty advisors – a task that can be exceptionally difficult for transfer students. You could literally feel how much our advisors wanted to help us succeed during our time as CSUCI students and beyond. Although we both entered CSUCI knowing we wanted to graduate with our bachelors degree in psychology, that was really all we knew; however, the TLC program allowed us to explore the wide variety of avenues available to psychology students post graduation. Specifically, we were given advice on the graduate school application process, developed our curriculum vitae, created our personal statement, and crafted a detailed and specific development plan for our academic future. Recognizing the importance of multifaceted development, we were also provided with the opportunity to get hands-on experience via internships and research assistantships. Some of our cohorts even made award winning research conference presentations! In short, although words could never accurately convey our appreciation for having been a part of the TLC program, we both feel the TLC was a life changing experience for which we both will be forever grateful!"
